Location

The summer camp is located in building 951 in the Argonne Park Area, next to the child care center which is in building 952.

Registration

The program has spaces for 30 children each day with two camp counselors. Registration is on a first come first serve basis. To register your child you must submit a registration form and pay the registration fee of \$75.00.

Does your child's school get out before camp starts or begins again in the fall after camp is over? Call us about availability for those days as we may be able to help you!

If you also need care for a younger sibling during the summer, please call the center for availability!

Activities

The program provides a combination of open-ended curriculum topics for in and out of the classroom each week. The Camp Counselors work with the campers to develop areas of interest and expand on them to create week long projects.

Campers will experience an off-site trip or an on-site visitor/event at least once a week. A wide variety of field trips are planned both fun and educational.

Scheduling

Families can choose a full time or part time schedule. If choosing part time, the days must be a consistent schedule throughout the summer.

Families are only required to use the program for the weeks that they need care. This allows families to schedule vacations without having to pay for the weeks of camp that they don't need. This advance scheduling allows the program to serve more families. Each family is required to submit a list of weeks that they would like to use the program. Once we have made a commitment of attendance, families must pay for the weeks confirmed regardless of attendance.
