Schedule of Events

Week 1 — The Talking Tree, a delightful introductory presentation for young children, addresses how trees and people are dependent on each other and emphasizes why we must plant and help care for trees at the **Seward Park Environmental & Audubon Center**.

The **Outback Kangaroo Farm** provides a 40-minute tour that is both educational and recreational. The large menagerie of furry and feathered residents includes: kangaroos, wallabies, wallaroos, flying squirrels, llamas, lemurs, alpacas, pygmy goats, peacocks, ostriches, mini donkeys, parrots and emus.

Week 2 or 3— KidsQuest Children’s Museum is an educational and fun experience for students. It offers multidisciplinary activities and programs that encourage students of all abilities and learning styles, in a variety of exhibit areas.

Week 4—Early Learners First Nations Discovery Tour is a great introduction to the native people of the Northwest Coast. Geared for young learners, this tour uses stories, gallery exploration and our teaching collection to introduce Northwest Coast art and traditions to students. In the Burke’s Pacific Voices exhibit, students will hear a story, and then search the exhibit for objects found in the story. They will be able to touch real baskets, masks, and button blankets. Students will then make a Northwest Coast themed mask to take home with them.
