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CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS

Infants

Infant 2 talked about spring this month. For **Our World** lessons they went on walks to see all of the flowers and leaves on the trees in bloom! In **ArtSmart** they painted with flowers and the infants observed each flower and the different bright colors. With visual art, infants learn to use simple tools such as flowers to develop their small motor skills by exploring materials with varied textures, colors, and patterns.

Toddlers

During the month of April, the Toddler 2 class spent some time learning about chicks and eggs. The toddlers had the chance to use their sensory exploration skills to investigate some plastic eggs, baskets, and fake grass in the sensory table. In **Science Rocks**, they learned to experiment with volume as they filled up some baskets with the grass and eggs. The toddlers were learning to compare containers as they figured out how many eggs they could fit into their baskets by filling and dumping them.



Twos

In the Month of April, Twos 1 had been learning all about spring. They learned how this season could be filled with lots of rain. In a **Science Rocks** lesson, the children learned to use their sense of touch to describe rain they had caught in a cup outside. In **Artsmart**, the children used their small muscle skills to create thumb print flowers. Their fun did not stop there, as they engaged in spring bowling. They knocked down flower blocks and used their counting skills in **Math Counts** as they counted how many blocks they knocked down. Twos 1 looks forward to what other fun lessons spring will bring them!

Preschool

In the month of April, Preschool 2 learned all about the 'Amazing Alphabet' during different Language Works lessons. In a Well Aware lesson they discussed healthy food options and letter sounds when cutting up fruit and discussing each food's beginning sounds as they made fruit salad. In a Math Counts lesson they sorted letters by size and color and played a fun letter game called, "Kaboom!" In the middle of the month, they became paleontologists exploring the world of dinosaurs! In Science Rocks they explored chemical reactions by creating volcanoes. They also got creative in an ArtSmart lesson using bubble wrap to create textured skin and scales on their awesome dinosaurs!

Transition Tactics

Change is in the air and spring is finally here. Families are planning vacations and considering camps, and some children will be moving to new classrooms or even to a different school. Children (and many adults) thrive on predictability. The possibility of change often challenges children's sense of safety and security. Transitions are learning times that open doors to new opportunities. Below are tips to help children and parents transition to new experiences.

- **Be aware of your comfort level.** Children are active perceivers. They sense our concern and hesitation, read our every cue and react to adult unspoken emotions. If it's a new classroom, get to know the teachers and learn about the expectations and routines. Once you feel comfortable with the new situation, you will relay the message that this is a safe, fun place.
- **Give children information.** Talk about what is going to happen, where your child will be going, who will be going with them, and what will happen along the way. Be as informative as ages and stages allow. Explain what will be different, mention the fun activities they will be able to do in the new class, and equally important, discuss things that will remain the same.
- Read books about similar experiences. Maybe children will be going on an airplane, visiting
 relatives, enjoying a family vacation, moving to a new classroom, or going off to kindergarten.
 Reading stories about similar experiences are a dynamic way to familiarize children with upcoming
 new experiences.
- Empower children by making them part of the process. Children don't choose their class placement, but they can decide what color backpack to buy, help plan a new morning ritual, or draw pictures, bake cookies, or collect flowers for the new teachers.
- Know your child, and realize that each child's response is different. Children's reactions to transition depend upon their age, temperament and experience; some are cautious while others might embrace it with "Hello world, here I come."
