A regional manager (RM) oversees 6-8 centers, allowing them to work closely with their center directors and build relationships with all employees. This level of engagement allows RMs to be actively involved in supporting the professional growth and development of center staff.

Regional Managers are Experienced in Early Childhood Education

- Their bachelor's degree in Early Childhood Education or a related field
- 10-12 years' experience as a center director or comparable management and supervisory experience
- A combination of infant, toddler, or preschool teaching experience and administration

Regional Managers are an Extension of Your Center's Management Team

Regional managers visit each center at least once a month and are available to visit more often as needed. During center visits, the RM supports the teachers and center director with program implementation, often observing classrooms and providing feedback to ensure centers are meeting and exceeding program standards. On weekly 'touch base' calls, the RM provides guidance and follows up on goals from the previous visit. Regional managers are also highly involved in parent partnership meetings and parent events; they attend these on a regular basis.
